A Note From Our Executive Director

Dear Friends, Supporters, and Stakeholders,

It is with immense pride and gratitude that we present the first-ever Impact Report of the Dr. Doretha Pressey Southern Scholars Initiative. This report is a testament to our journey, our challenges, and our triumphs over the past five years. When we embarked on this mission, we had a vision to create access, equity, and success for students of color from low-income communities in rural South Carolina. Today, as we reflect on our progress, we are reminded of the collective effort, dedication, and unwavering support that has brought us to this milestone.

Since our inception, Southern Scholars Initiative has been steadfast in its commitment to transforming lives through education. Guided by the principles of **Education**, **Determination**, **and Generosity**, we have awarded over \$285,000 in scholarships and more than \$10,000 in emergency aid to 18 Scholars. Our Scholars have demonstrated exceptional academic excellence, maintaining an average GPA of 3.4 or better.

This report highlights the impactful programs and initiatives that have been the cornerstone of our success. Our world-class college completion advising program, robust mentorship initiative, and strategic partnerships with esteemed organizations like NCAN, The College Board, InternXL, Level All, and Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity Inc., have played pivotal roles in supporting our Scholars' journeys.

Moreover, the Southern Scholars Initiative's commitment to community engagement has fostered meaningful relationships and garnered support from private donors, corporate sponsors, and local community organizations. These collaborations have been instrumental in breaking the cycle of poverty in Bamberg and Orangeburg Counties, empowering our Scholars to pursue higher education and build a brighter future.

However, like many Black-led, Black-benefiting grassroots organizations, we face significant challenges in securing consistent funding. Despite the undeniable success of our programs, the funding landscape remains deeply inequitable. The 2024 State of Black Nonprofits Report by Giving Gap reveals that Black-led nonprofits typically receive 76% less revenue and hold 24% fewer net assets than their white-led counterparts. Furthermore, only 2% of all philanthropic funding from the nation's largest foundations is specifically directed to Black communities. For Southern Scholars Initiative, this means that while our impact is undeniable, our ability to sustain and scale our programs is often constrained by the lack of financial resources. We need your continued and increased support to ensure that we can not only maintain but expand our efforts to uplift and empower our country's next generation of leaders (Giving Gap, 2024).

As we look ahead, we remain focused on our strategic priorities for growth and sustainability. Our vision for the future includes program enhancement, financial growth, marketing and media expansion, increased community engagement, and the development of our dedicated team and Board of Directors. We are excited about the opportunities that lie ahead and the continued impact we can make together.

This 5-Year Impact Report is more than a summary of our achievements; it is a celebration of the lives we have touched and a reaffirmation of our mission. We extend our heartfelt thanks to all who have supported us on this journey. Your belief in our vision and your generous contributions have made this progress possible.

Education, Determination, and Generosity were three of the core principles that exemplified Dr. Pressey's life and work and they have become work is based.

Southern Scholars provides a foundation of financial, community, and career support necessary for Scholar success. We exist to dismantle the barriers that students of color from the Rural South so often face when pursuing higher education. In turn, our Scholars learn the skills necessary to become successful in their careers and upstanding advocates for their communities.

Our History

Dr. Doretha Pressey, born on February 18, 1961, in Bamberg, SC, was a trailblazer in education and a beacon of inspiration. She pursued her education at Voorhees College, earning a Bachelor of Science in History, Education, and Educational Policy, along with an Associate's Degree in Criminal Justice. She continued her academic journey with a Master's degree in Educational Administration from American International College and a Certificate of Advanced Graduate Study in Education Supervision. In 1997, Dr. Pressey achieved a Doctorate in Education, Policy, Research, and Administration from the University of Massachusetts at Amherst, becoming the first in her family to reach this level of academic success.


A middle child of 7 boys and girls, Dr. Pressey and her siblings were deeply inspired by their mother, **Clara Mae Coleman.** Although Mrs. Coleman was unable to complete high school, she taught all of her children and grandchildren to fiercely value education.

Dr. Pressey's career began as a teacher's aide in Denmark, SC. Her innovative teaching methods and compassionate discipline quickly propelled her to the role of high school History teacher and then assistant principal in Springfield, MA, where she was one of the youngest women to hold that position in the city's history. Later, she became a beloved Professor of Education at Morgan State University, also teaching at Chestnut Hill College, Mt. Holyoke University, Cambridge College, and Montgomery Community College.

Driven by her belief that every child deserves the opportunity to achieve their dreams, Dr. Pressey founded STOP: The Support Teen Outreach Program, a nonprofit dedicated to helping at-risk youth and underserved families. The Southern Scholars Initiative is an extension of this visionary work, continuing her legacy of educational empowerment and community support.

Known for her profoundly generous spirit, Dr. Pressey was always ready to help others, prioritizing her family despite a demanding career. Dr. Pressey passed away unexpectedly in 2018, and her family established the Southern Scholars Initiative in her honor.


Dr. Pressey's legacy lives on through the Southern Scholars Initiative, which continues to inspire and support students, reflecting her lifelong commitment to education and service.



Over the past five years, the Dr. Doretha Pressey Southern Scholars Initiative has proudly supported 18 Scholars with a total of \$300,000 in scholarships and emergency aid (housing, books, technology needs, etc.) Our dedication to academic excellence is evident in our Scholars' impressive 100% persistence rate and their average GPA of 3.4 or higher. Among our achievements, we celebrate the graduation of three Scholars, with one now pursuing a PhD.

We have established valuable partnerships with three high schools across two school districts, extending our reach and impact. Our commitment to holistic development is further demonstrated through three enriching Summer Immersion Travel Experiences (SITE), with a fourth planned for 2025, providing our Scholars with invaluable experiences and opportunities for growth.

A cornerstone of our success has been the development of our **Five Pillars of Scholar Success**. These pillars encompass Scholarship, Academic Coaching, Career Readiness and Mentorship, Service, and Travel, providing a comprehensive framework that supports our Scholars in achieving their academic and personal goals.

These accomplishments highlight our ongoing mission to empower students through education and to foster meaningful, positive change in their lives and communities.


Financial Report

We made \$65,000 in direct awards to scholars this year--more than ever before.






Supporting more scholars means bringing on staff as well as increasing awards.
